Cultural learning syllabus moves away from traditional blackboard teachings and instead incorporates innovative learning method such as dramas, songs and poems and sight and sound including an appreciation of year-round Chinese cultural events.

Playgroup is available from infancy onwards to kindergarten, pre-primary and Year 1 to Year 12 including HSK and WACE. Adult classes are being conducted at beginners, intermediate and advanced levels. Classroom hours are held on **Saturdays between 9:00 am & 11:30 am**. Enrolment is open to the public throughout the year.

Choices of extra-curriculum activities are available such as arts and crafts, calligraphy, cartoon drawing, Chinese dance, Chinese drawing, painting, sketching, rhymes singing, table tennis, martial arts, lion dance, Chinese musical instrument guzheng, flute and others. All three campuses offer these activities between **11:30 am & 12:30 pm** immediately following classroom study. Students and the public are encouraged to enrol and participate in any one of these activities.

Chung Wah Chinese School is steeped in history and traditions with a humble beginning which stemmed out of parental enthusiasm to give the next generation an opportunity to read, write, listen and speak Mandarin. A network of parent volunteers has existed since the early days when the school was first established more than three decades ago.

Parental involvement and logistical support within School Management Committees across three campuses have been known and remain as a source of competitive strength of the Chung Wah Chinese School in engaging the interests of many children and supporters. Without this, the supply chain in providing Chinese education will be inefficient. Value proposition in offering Chinese education effectively, conveniently and affordably is another vital element that differentiates the Chung Wah Chinese School from its competitors. The availability of a pool of quality teaching resources at all levels of teaching reinforces children's learning interests.
