IMPORTANT UPDATE

The WA Government has announced a full lockdown for everyone living in metropolitan Perth and the Peel region for the next three days starting from midnight tonight Friday 23 April until 12.01am Tuesday 27 April 2021, pending obliging expert health advice. During this time, Chung Wah Hall in James St and Chung Wah Cultural Centre in Balcatta will be closed for activities and visitors. All Chung Wah Chinese School classes will be postponed for one week at all campuses.

Chung Wah encourages everyone to keep up to date with the latest announcements from the State Government. Should the lockdown not be extended beyond Monday, then we expect activities will be able to return to normal on Tuesday. If the lockdown is extended further, then we will review the Directions and provide advice as necessary.

Three day lockdown for Perth & Peel

Temporary restrictions will apply until 12:01am Tuesday, 27 April, pending ongoing expert health advice.

From 6:00pm today (23 April)

Masks will be mandatory for people aged 12 and over in Perth and Peel except:

- while at home
- during vigorous outdoor exercise
- while in a vehicle with members of your own household

Please use common sense. Exemptions apply, including for people with disabilities.

From midnight tonight (12:01am Saturday 24 April)

Stay home except for these four reasons, or in an emergency situation:

- For work where it is not possible to work remotely
- For purchasing essential goods including food, groceries, medical or necessary supplies
- For one hour of outdoor exercise per day
- For medical or health care purposes, including looking after the vulnerable

Regional boundary in place around Perth and Peel

Travel to other regions restricted to exempt reasons only.
Anyone who has been in Perth or Peel since 17 April must wear a mask.

Other restrictions include:

- Private gatherings not permitted.
- Hospitality venues restricted to takeaway only.
- The following must close: fitness/recreational venues, casinos, nightclubs, entertainment venues, playgrounds, skate parks, outdoor recreational facilities, religious gatherings/ places of worship and cultural institutions.
- Visits to hospitals and aged/disability care are prohibited except for compassionate reasons.
- Community sport cancelled. Major sports events may proceed without crowds.
- ANZAC Day events cancelled. Driveway dawn services encouraged.
- Public events are not permitted.
- Weddings and funerals can proceed with up to 100 guests, but masks must be worn.
